Stockman Competition Guidelines

Participants must be enrolled in one or more of the following projects in the Frontier District: Beef, Swine Sheep, Goat and/or Horse. (This maybe expanded in the future.)

The Stockman Competition will be divided into four components:

- Agri-Knowledge (information will include Nutrition, Animal Systems, Animal Health, Animal Management, Genetics and/or Performance Data). Questions will be in a Multiple Choice or True and False format on a scantron sheet. Total points = 100
- 2. **Livestock Judging/Evaluation classes.** 50 pts each with one oral reason class and one question class. These could include breeding and/or market but could also include horses at halter. Total points = 200
- 3. Showmanship class. The participant will bring to the fair only one of their animal projects as listed above for a showmanship contest. Participants will need to be prepared to answer questions directly related to their project. Participants might also be prepared to show a different animal brought by another participant. Total points = 100
- 4. **Advocacy Video.** This will be a 2-4-minute video presentation sent to Danny Rice <u>prior to the fair</u>. Total points = 100

The topic for Senior and Intermediate Divisions will be "What can I do to become an advocate for the livestock industry"?

The Junior Division Advocacy Presentation Video will be a 2-4 minute presentation on their livestock project including purpose of the animal, breed of the animal and care/health/feeding of the animal.
