Farm and Tractor Safety Training (H.O.T.)

The Frontier Extension District will sponsor a Hazardous Occupation Training (H.O.T.) on **June 2, 2021**. The class will meet from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. at the Pomona Community Center, 219 Jefferson Street. Pre-registration is required by contacting any Frontier Extension District Office ASAP! The class is free; however, youth <u>are required</u> to purchase a \$10 manual from the Extension Office and to <u>read and study the material prior to the class</u>.

Training is required for any 14-15-year-old youth wanting to operate farm tractor(s) or use lawnmowers/tractors larger than 20 HP. The only time a youth would be exempt is if he/she works on the "family farm". However, if the "family farm" is a partnership, is incorporated or if the youth is working on a grandparent's farm, the training is required.

Livestock "Last Call" Tagging

A "Last Call" tagging will be available on **June 8th**, 5:00 p.m.-6:00 p.m., at the Franklin County Fairgrounds, 220 W. 17th, in Ottawa. This tagging is for any Frontier District 4-H member needing Meat Goat(s), Sheep or Swine tagged for shows such as the Kansas State Fair, Kansas Junior Livestock Show, etc. Contact the Extension Office with any questions.

Nominations Due for KSF and KILS

Commercial Heifer, ALL Swine, ALL Sheep & ALL Meat Goat nominations must be postmarked by **June 15th** for the Kansas State Fair and the Kansas Junior Livestock Show. **Be sure the forms are current:** "February 2021" is at the bottom of the page. The "Rookie Guide" is helpful! An agent's signature is required, so plan accordingly. DON"T wait until the last minute!

Include 4-H Experiences in a Resume or Interview

Here are tips for putting 4-H experiences on a resume and to have a successful interview! These are excellent resources to use while filling out a scholarship application, a job application or preparing for an interview!

New 4-H Project Record Report Form

The 4-H project record report form will fully replace the KAP this year. The new system will emphasize project learning and growth and resembles a record more than an award application. It will also help develop career readiness skills.

The new forms, an instructional guide and check sheet, an evaluation rubric, a form fillable personal page and a permanent record are available, as is a **free** download of the current Adobe Reader DC (this download is required to use the new forms). Videos are also available! Watch and learn how to navigate the new forms!

There are **two versions** - an animal form (includes ALL animals, beef to handpets) and a general project form. There are three age levels-juniors, ages 7-9; intermediates, ages 10-13; and seniors, ages 14-18. Everyone will use the new forms! COUNTY LEVEL: 4-H members will submit a project

record report form for each project. The report form includes the forms, project reflection and photos.

AREA LEVEL (seniors only): For each eligible project, submit a project record report form, cover letter and resume.

STATE LEVEL: For each project area, the top two senior 4-H members from the regional screening will submit his/her project record report form, cover letter, resume and a video.

The following ingredients or products <u>are not</u> allowed in any food entry at any Kansas fair or exhibition:

- · Raw eggs or raw flour in uncooked frostings or fillings
- Cream cheese frostings or fillings
- · Chocolate ganache or heavy cream frostings
- Lemon curd
- Fresh cut fruits or vegetables as garnishes
- Custard, Cream or Chiffon pies
- Fresh (unbaked) fruit pies (ex: fresh strawberry pie)
- Any meats
- Friendship bread starters, not refrigerated

Fun With Food Science: Virtual Baking Camp

The Fun with Food Science: Virtual Baking Camp will be **July 12-15**, **2021**, 9:00 a.m. to Noon daily. It is designed for students entering sixth grade to exiting eighth grade. Handson, interactive demonstrations, videos and discussions will teach campers the secrets of the chemistry behind foods, including the process of making sourdough bread (from creating a "starter" to baking a soft, yet crusty loaf). Participants will learn about innovations in specialty diets, food trends, culinary careers and the essentials of food safety, while making cookies, pizza and bread at home, Camp will end with a grand "show-and-tell" with the rest of the class.

Levels II and III may be required for the KSF (depending on class choice). Online/video levels testing will be accepted. Level testing and testing info is available in the Ext. Office. Find an evaluator for the final portion (riding).

District Horse Show Info and DATE CHANGE!

The District Horse Show date has been changed to **July 1**, **2021**, in Topeka. To participate in riding classes at a district and/or state horse show, youth, ages 9-18, must have successfully met the requirements of all sections of Achievement Level I. Entries must be postmarked by **June 10th**.

District Horse Show Participation Changes: Eligible 4-H members may participate in his/her designated District Horse Show plus one additional District Horse Show of his/her choosing. Before entering the KSF, indicate which District Horse Show results are being used. **ONLY ONE** of the shows may be used (not a combo of the two).

Meats Judging "All Star" Team

There will now be an "All-Star" Meats Judging Team chosen in the same manner as livestock teams for the past few years. This will allow the state winning county/extension district team to compete at the National Western, thus preserving the ability to compete at a national competition as a team. The State Meats Judging Contest held at the 4-H Sweepstakes will serve as the qualifying contest and the top eight participants eligible to compete in the National Contest will be given the opportunity to compete for the "All-Star" team. Participation in two or three weekend workout sessions at KSU will be required. The total points from combined state contest and practice sessions will be used to determine the representatives for the "All-Star" team participation at the National Contest held in conjunction with the American Royal and hosted at KSU in October. Kansas State will provide coaching through current and former meat judging team members and graduate students. Chaperones will be recruited. The county/extension district winning team will be provided the opportunity to compete in January at the National Western. "All-Star" team members will complete the 4-H meat judging eligibility after the competition at the National Contest in October.

Kansas 4-H Wheat Expo: This wheat fun-day showcases all things wheat. The event is August 11, 2021 in El Dorado. There will be eight contests open to youth members with cash prizes and ribbons awarded. There will be a \$6 per person fee and registration will be June 15th-August 1st. Visual Arts Changes for Fair

Kansas 4-H will be introducing a guide for copyright considerations in Visual Arts state fair exhibits. This will help illustrate the following: I) Understand when author acknowledgement and approval is necessary; 2) How to request from the author permission to display; 3) What written "permissions to display" exhibitors are to bring to local judging of exhibits. This pilot period will be a time to educate and clarify what Kansas 4-H copyright policies and procedures will be.

Write a letter to request permission to display; 4) Upon approval, display properly. Appropriately source the author and show or verify permission to display to the judges.



Anderson Co. Scholarship Clarification

Available for all Anderson County 4-H youth: Anderson County 4-H Council will offer a \$50 scholarship to 4-H members attending any out-of-county event (Insect Spectacular, State Geology Field Trip, etc.). This scholarship can be used to help cover the cost of an in-person or virtual event. For 4-H members attending *Camp, Campference or Discovery Days: the scholarship will be \$100. If the event is virtual and is less than \$100, the fee will be covered completely. Youth are eligible to receive the scholarship only once per 4-H year (Oct. 1st-Sept. 30th).

Also available is the Jeanette Arnett Event Scholarship. This \$20 scholarship will be awarded to youth attending any 4-H event that promotes personal or project development. There is no limit to the number of times a youth may apply.

One application covers both event scholarships and must be submitted prior to the event payment deadline.

*This year, any scholarship awarded for Camp at Rock Springs will be reimbursed to the camper, if eligible, after campers have returned from the event.

Franklin County Mr. and Miss 4-H Contest

All properly enrolled Franklin County 4-H members who are and will be in high school for a few more years are encouraged to turn in an application for Mr. or Miss 4-H. Applications are due by **June 28th.**

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to, helping and handing out awards at the Fair Livestock Auction, Awards Programs and Achievement Night, making appearances on behalf of Franklin County 4-H whenever needed and reigning throughout the 4-H year. Applicants are required to fill out an application and participate in an interview. An interview time should be scheduled when turning in paperwork at the Ottawa Office. An interview date is TBD.

Breed Paperwork Due to Office

Purebred Market Steers, Breeding Heifers, Market Hogs and Breeding Gilts must be registered to show in the purebred classes. Registration papers must be in the name of the exhibitor by May 1st of the current year. Animals may be co-registered by two or more youth in the same family but cannot be registered in a farm name or include the name of adults. For beef, the animal's individual tattoo number must match the tattoo number on the registration papers. For swine, the animal's individual ear notch must match the ear notch on the registration papers. All steers, heifers, market hogs and breeding gilts without registration papers will show in the Crossbred class. Papers must be dropped off at the Extension Office by June 28th. Papers must also be presented at fair check-in.

Fair Paperwork for Bucket Calf & Clothing Members

Members enrolled in Clothing or Bucket Calf have paperwork which must be presented at judging time during the Franklin County Fair. Bucket Calf members must present the project record sheet and Clothing members must present a Wardrobe Planning Packet

Shooting Sports Info & Practice Schedule

To help offset costs, the group will continue to require a \$25 fee for each shooter with a \$75 maximum per family.
