GENERAL NEWS

New Raffle Policy and Guidelines

Due to the recent changes in a 2015 Kansas law, it is now possible for nonprofit and education entities to conduct raffles. However, a new raffle policy and guidelines must be followed. Beginning June 1, 2016 in the Frontier Extension District, if an Extension unit-affiliated group (e.g. 4-H club or 4-H project group, etc.) wants to conduct a raffle, an application must first be submitted. All applications must be approved prior to conducting the raffle by the Extension District Board (which meets monthly). A raffle application, raffle final report and other additional requirements may be found at http://www.frontierdistrict.k-state.edu/policies/index.html or the Extension Office. Completed raffle applications for Board approval may be sent to any Frontier Extension District Office.

Join Us on the Radio

The Frontier Extension District 4-H program has a ten minute radio spot on KOFO 1220 AM that airs every Wednesday at 6:40 a.m. All 4-H members are invited to share 4-H experiences, talk about upcoming community service projects, club happenings, etc. Several 4-H members have done a radio spot and found it to be quite fun. The end of the 4-H year is right around the corner! Please note the District wide changes which are applicable to all Frontier District 4-H members this year. Generic project record sheets may be used, but ONLY KAPs will be used to choose county project champions. Also, KAPs will be age-appropriate this year. For example, an 11 year old member will fill out the KAP appropriate for that age division and a Senior aged member (14-18) will use the Senior KAP. Kansas State Fair Scholarship Available

The primary objective of the Ron and Carolyn Holland Scholarship is to financially support the educational pursuits of Kansas State Fair youth exhibitors who possess outstanding character, perseverance, work ethic, ingenuity and demonstrated scholastic achievement, consistent with the values endeared by the Holland family. The applicant must be a current or past 4-H/FFA member who will be entering an accredited college academic program majoring in an ag related field of study. Scholarship Application

The Vanier Family Scholarship Program was established to enhance the strong leadership skills already exhibited by 4-H members. This program invests in the educational endeavors of young people who have overcome challenges in his/her life to pursue educational goals. The scholarship recipients will be recognized leaders and role models who have balanced "greater than usual" demands and contributed in positive ways as a 4-H member and citizen.

Students will receive a \$7000/year scholarship for use at community or technical institutions and a \$12,000/year scholarship for use at baccalaureate institutions. Recipients will receive half of the scholarship for the fall semester and the remaining half in the spring. They will also be encouraged to participate in up to two leadership development experiences throughout the 2016-17 academic year.

Testing will be free to any Frontier District 4-H Member. Some birds may need to be retested in order to be eligible for the Kansas State Fair.

CONTINUING VOLUNTEERS:

Annual Renewal

All continuing direct volunteers need to complete the Kansas 4-H Volunteer Renewal Form for the 2015-16 4-H year. The Renewal Form is available at the bottom of the page on the District's 4-H website under "Volunteers" or at http://bookstore.ksre.k-state.edu/pubs/4H953.pdf. Print, complete (be sure to sign on the back) and return the Renewal Form to the Extension Office. Forms are also available in the Extension Office. Continuing volunteers should also be enrolled in the 4HOnline System. Please contact the Extension Office to have questions answered.

NEW VOLUNTEERS:

Episodic, Indirect or Direct Volunteers?

An Episodic or Indirect Volunteer is not required to complete the Volunteer Screening Process. Examples include a Judge or Superintendent at fairs, a Workshop Presenter, Guest Speaker and a PDC, Fair Board or Extension Board member. A Direct Volunteer is required to complete the Volunteer Screening Process (see below). Examples include a Club Leader, County Wide Leader, Project Leader, Camp Counselor, Event or Overnight Chaperone and/or Chauffeur (transporting any 4-H members).

Kansas 4-H Volunteer Screening Process

In order for the process to flow smoothly, please complete the following steps in order:

- I. Complete the Kansas 4-H Volunteer Service Application available at http://bookstore.ksre.k-state.edu/pubs/4H673.pdf and turn it in to the Extension Office. Copies are also available in the Extension Office.
- 2. Enroll in the 4HOnline Enrollment System (a 4-H member should already be enrolled) at https://ks.4honline.com. Only after a completed enrollment has been made "active" by the Extension Office will a volunteer be able to proceed to the next step.
- **3.** Complete the Volunteer Orientation Training. Steps I and 2 must be completed prior to this step. The Orientation Training is <u>only</u> available through the 4H-Online Enrollment System. **Please read the directions!** A link for Orientation and the directions can be found on the District's 4-H website under "Volunteers". (FYI-The option to print a certificate is not working.)
- **4. Schedule a face to face interview** with an Extension Agent or 4-H Program Assistant.
- 5. After steps I-4 are completed, the Extension Office will provide information on how to complete a required background check.
- **6.** Wait for communication from the Extension Office. The final step is approval by the Extension Board. A notification letter will be mailed to the volunteer from the Extension Office.

*ENTRIES: STATE REQUIREMENT - The State of Kansas requires all livestock exhibitors provide a completed W- 9 form each year PRIOR to issuing any premium winnings. Please complete a W-9 and submit or send it to the Kansas State Fair, Attn: Competitive Exhibits Dept., 2000 N. Poplar, Hutchinson, KS 67502 prior to the start of the Fair. Forms can also be completed when setting up an exhibitor account at www.kansasstatefair.com.

Entering Exhibits for the Kansas State Fair

Horses - Member must be nine (9) years old and have qualified at the District Horse Show. Those who qualify at the District level will be entered by the District Horse Show Coordinator.

Livestock - Member must be nine (9) years old. Market animals must have been nominated at an earlier date.

Grand Drive entries for livestock must be entered by July 15th and require an agent's signature. Late entry forms will be accepted until July 25th with a late fee of \$25 per head. This is in addition to the regular entry fees. **No entries will be accepted after July 25, 2016**.

The Following Items MUST BE PRE-ENTERED in the Extension Office by AUGUST 8th:

Visual Arts - Member must be nine (9) years old and have had his/her exhibit selected by the judges at a qualifying fair. The KSF will allow four (4) exhibits from Anderson County and five (5) exhibits Franklin County, which is relative to the number of members in the Visual Arts project. In Osage County, those exhibitors with qualifying projects will be notified if his/her exhibit has been selected for the State Fair.

Fiber Arts - Member must be nine (9) years old and have received a purple ribbon on the exhibit at a qualifying fair.

Other Exhibits - Member must be nine (9) years old and have received a purple ribbon on the exhibit at a qualifying fair. Poultry, Rabbits & Dogs - Member must have received a purple or blue ribbon at a qualifying show.

Demonstrations/Illustrated Talks - Member must be nine (9) years old and have received a purple ribbon on his/her demonstration/illustrated talk at the District Club Day competition in February 2016.

Fashion Revue - Age requirement remains at 14 years of age.

Getting Exhibits to the Kansas State Fair

All perishable and non-perishable items must be pre-entered in the Extension Office by AUGUST 8th. It is a simple process. Members may call or come in to the Office and pre-enter all State Fair exhibits. When ready to send exhibits, non-perishable items should be brought to the Extension Office by Wednesday, August 26th (Except Anderson County). Perishable items should be brought to the Office by Noon on Thursday, September 8th for Franklin County and by 8:30 a.m. on Friday, September 9th for Osage County. ALL State Fair exhibits for Anderson County must be in the Extension Office by 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 8th. Those with questions should contact the Extension Office. Any exhibit not pre-entered cannot be accepted and will not be sent to the State Fair.

The Extension Office will take as many exhibits to the State Fair as the van and trailer can hold. **NO** live animals or flowers. For large items, such as woodworking, electrical, etc., please check with the Office ahead of time for space availability. The Extension Office will pick up any items taken out. Any member wanting to take out and pick up his/her own exhibits may contact the Extension Office for rules and entry times.

State Fair Premium Money

All Franklin and Osage County 4-H Members may pick up State Fair premium money in his/her respective County Extension Office beginning **November 15th.** Each Anderson County 4-H member will receive his/her premium money from the club treasurer. Checks from the KSF will be mailed to those exhibiting livestock. Premium money not claimed in Franklin or Osage County by **February 1, 2017** will be donated.
