Add/Drop Project Deadline

Frontier District 4-H members have the ability to change personal information or add/drop a project at any time by logging on to https://ks.4honline.com. Members need not contact the Extension Office to have information changed. Any adding or dropping of projects must be done by May Ist in order for the member to be eligible to enter in the 4-H Divisions of the Fair. Project information cannot be changed after the deadline. Direct all questions to the Extension Office. Refer to the member's county page for all animal ownership/tagging deadline dates.

Nomination Papers Due and YQCA Certification Needed

Market Beef nominations for the Kansas State Fair or the Kansas Junior Livestock Show must be postmarked by **May 1st**. Agents will only sign <u>properly completed forms and families are</u> <u>encouraged to plan accordingly when needing signatures.</u>

The Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and Kansas Jr. Livestock Show will <u>require all exhibitors</u>, ages 8+, to complete the YQCA, Youth for the Quality Care of Animals, certification to be <u>eligible to exhibit in the 2019 shows</u>. Certification must be completed online by June 15th and certification is only valid for one year. A valid (as of 10/1/19) Youth PQA+ number may still be used. A copy of the YQCA or Youth PQA+ certificate must be attached to the Declaration Form (form has changed; read carefully). Details and the Rookie Guide (very helpful) are available at www.asi.k-state.edu/research-and-extension/youth-programs/nominated-livestock/ or in the Office.

Camp & Counselor Registration - Important Information

Registration for <u>campers and counselors</u> will be done online through CampDocs and everything can be completed from the comfort of home, including payment (for campers)! **REGISTRATION** is available **April 1st-15th** on the District's 4-H website under "District Events". NOTE: Have all insurance, doctor and health (shots, meds) information handy. A picture of the camper is optional.

CAMPERS, ages 7-12, will attend Rock Springs 4-H Center June 17-20, 2019. FULL PAYMENT will be due by April 15th. Enrollment and payment will be completed ONLINE. Those unable to pay online with a credit/debit card may come to the Extension Office to register and pay with cash or a check only. IF there are not enough counselors to cover the number of campers, campers will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. So, campers are encouraged to sign up early! Scholarship info is available on the member's county page. ALL club scholarships will be processed through the club, not through the Office.

COUNSELORS must be at least 16 years of age and must be an approved volunteer. There is no cost for counselors and they will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. However, teen counselors will be given priority over adults so they may be awarded the leadership opportunity. Counselors will also be required to attend a training, date TBD. Contact JoAnna in the Ottawa Office at 785-229-3520 to see what volunteer paperwork is needed as all paperwork must be completed by May Ist! This may be a longer process than expected, so call ASAP! Anyone interested must register for camp at the above website and please contact the Extension Office to let us know you are interested.

Member Clarification: A Cloverbud member may showcase exhibits at fairs or public events but may not participate in any competitive 4-H events (including livestock events) or have 4-H livestock projects which require long-term, ongoing care or weigh-ins. Proper enrollment in the 4HOnline System is also required.

Eligibility to Exhibit at County Fair(s)

To be a Frontier District 4-H member eligible to exhibit in the 4-H division at the fair(s) within the member's respective county, each member (new or returning) must be properly enrolled in the 4HOnline System by May 1, 2019. Some projects, like many livestock species, have required dates prior to May 1st such as weigh-in/tagging for livestock. Families without internet access may come to the Extension Office by the May 1st deadline to use the office computers. This **FIRM** deadline will be upheld to ensure the integrity of the project(s) and to allow for appropriate educational time in the project(s).

Enrolling in 4-H

Families may enroll in 4-H at any time at https://ks.4honline. com. The cost is \$15.00. Families may pay with a credit card (follow the instructions carefully), pay by check (mail to State within five days of enrolling) or may request a waiver. <u>DO</u> <u>NOT bring payments to the Office.</u> An enrollment guide is available on the District's 4-H website under "Join" and new families are encouraged to review the guide prior to beginning the enrollment process. Families should also realize there are deadlines for exhibiting projects at the fair (i.e. weigh-in dates, etc.). <u>All members should note that enrollment must be properly completed by May 1st in order for the member to be eligible to enter in the 4-H Divisions of the Fair. Only after the enrollment process is properly completed will the family receive newsletters and other communications. Direct all questions to the Office.</u>

4-H Family Handbook Available

The 4-H Family Handbook is available for Frontier District families. It is filled with important information explaining what to expect from the 4-H experience, terminology, events, what to do as a parent, etc. All families are encouraged to review the information, but it would be especially helpful to new 4-H families. The Handbook is available on the District's 4-H website under "Join". Feel free to contact the Extension Office if there are any questions.

Branding Information for Ordering T-Shirts, Etc.

All printed 4-H t-shirts, banners, posters, etc. <u>must be cobranded</u> with the K-State Research and Extension logo and the 4-H clover. The brand must be done in a specific fashion and the items should be ordered from an approved vendor. Various branding options can be seen at www.kansas4-h.org/ resources/marketing/index.html (click on "Digital Resources" at the bottom) so decisions can be made on where to place the brand. An approved vendor list and an application to become a licensed vendor may be found at www.k-state.edu/logos/. <u>All</u> groups and clubs planning to place an order <u>are expected to</u> <u>follow these rules</u>. <u>Before ordering</u>, groups should send a copy of the front and back of the item to Janae so she can confirm the brand is being used correctly. <u>Contact the Extension Office for a list of locally approved businesses</u>.

Raffle Policy and Guidelines

Clubs discussing fundraising options should note the following information. Nonprofit and education entities may now conduct raffles. However, a raffle policy and guidelines must be followed. <u>Any</u> Extension unit-affiliated group (e.g. 4-H club, 4-H project group, etc.) wanting to conduct a raffle must first fill out and submit an application. The Extension District Board meets monthly, at the end of the month, and all applications must be approved by them prior to conducting the raffle. <u>A final report must then be presented to the</u> <u>Board upon completion of the raffle.</u> All forms and other requirements can be found on the District's website under "Policies" or in the Extension Office. All completed raffle applications may be sent to or dropped off at any Frontier Extension District Office to await Board approval.

Entomology Changes for Fair

The following changes will be made for the Kansas State Fair as well as local county fairs within the Frontier District. Families are encouraged to read the rules for all fairs.

I). Choosing the Taxonomy of Option A or B is now the 4-H member's choice. The 4-H member DOES NOT have to change to Option B if he/she does not want to do so.

2). The guidelines for the Educational Exhibit class have been expanded. While 4-H members can still make an insect collection exhibit in the standard display box, a poster, display, game, webpage or any other creative exhibit that fits within the space allowed can also be made. It is strongly encourage that educational exhibits be related to learning experiences from the <u>Teaming With Insects</u> curriculum found at www.kansas4-h.org/projects/agriculture-and-natural-resources/ entomology.html.

District-Wide Favorite Food Contest

The Frontier District 4-H Favorite Food Contest will be **June** 7, 2019, at Celebration Hall, 220 W. 17th, in Ottawa. Set up will be at Noon and judging will begin at 12:30 p.m. The contest is for properly enrolled Frontier District 4-H members currently enrolled in the Foods project. Pre-register by **May 24th** by calling the Extension Office. There will a winner chosen from each age division in each county and he/she will be eligible to participate in the Area Favorite Food Show on **June 11th** in Emporia. See page six for details regarding other judging contests on the above dates in Ottawa and Emporia. Direct all questions to the Extension Office.

Contest Details: Each contestant will select a favorite food recipe from the following food groups: snack, salad, dessert, soup, meat, vegetable plate, sandwich, fruit, bread, drink, casserole and other. The prepared favorite food should then be displayed with 1) a proper table setting (formal or informal, depending on the food choice), including a centerpiece, optional; 2) a recipe card for the favorite food and; 3) a planned menu which includes the favorite food. The 4-H exhibitor is responsible for providing all equipment including a card table. Electrical appliances are not allowed. Judges WILL NOT taste the food due to food safety concerns. Be prepared to explain how to prepare and serve the favorite food, discuss the nutritional value, state why the table service and dishes were selected and why the centerpiece is suitable.

Horse Snaffle Bit Projects

Horse snaffle bit projects are due to the Extension Office by **May 1st**. Along with the nomination, the 4-H member must submit the Horse ID and a \$10 fee. Three-year old snaffle bit projects must have been nominated the previous year and did not have to be shown to be re-nominated. This 4-H year is the final year for the 2-year-old project because intense training of young horses is physically too demanding; therefore, the focus will be on 3-year-olds. State Fair entries for 2- and 3-year-old projects are due **August 1st** in the State 4-H Office. Remember these rules: No one is allowed to ride this nominated horse except the 4-H member from May I until the conclusion of the Kansas State Fair. This includes a trainer, parents, horseless horse member, another 4-H member, sibling, potential buyer, etc. Visit www.kansas4-h.org/projects/ animals/horse.html for more information.

The East Central District Horse Show will be **July 9, 2019**, in Lawrence at the Douglas County Fairgrounds. To participate in riding classes at a district and/or state horse show, youth, ages 9-18, must have successfully met the requirements of all three sections of Achievement Level I. Showmanship and Halter class participants must pass the first two sections of Achievement Level I, plus the Ground Work portion of the skill test prior to the District entry deadline. Horseless Horse Project Clarifications

Youth enrolled in the Horseless Horse project will abide by the following rules set forth by the State 4-H Office:

I). The 4-H member does not own or lease a horse.

2). The project is intended to offer the 4-H member an opportunity to learn about horses.

3). The 4-H member may participate in judging contests, quiz bowl, hippology and give presentations.

4). The 4-H member may volunteer to assist another 4-H member at horse shows and trail rides.

5). The 4-H member may exhibit at the local fair with a borrowed 4-H identified horse in the showmanship class only.6). No riding is permitted.

If questions remain, feel free to contact any of the County Horse leaders (information below) or the Extension Office.

The ownership deadline date for Breeding Livestock, Bucket Calf (must have been born Jan. I-May I of the current year), all Rabbits and Fowl is May Ist. For the local county fair, breeding livestock does not have to be tagged.

2019 Franklin County Fair Changes for Beef & Swine The following rules are in conjunction with the KSF:

Market Steers and Breeding Heifers must be registered to be shown in the purebred classes. Original registration or transfer papers for steers and heifers must be in the name of the exhibitor by **May 1st** of the current year. Animals may be co-registered by two or more youth in the same family but cannot be registered in a farm name or include the name of adults. The individual tattoo number of the animal must match the tattoo on the registration papers. Papers *must* be presented at fair check-in. All steers and heifers without registration papers will show in the Crossbred class.

Purebred Market Hogs and Breeding Gilts must have original registration or transfer papers in the name of the exhibitor by **May 1st** of the current year. Animals may be co-registered by two or more youth in the same family but cannot be in a farm name or include the name of adults. The individual ear notch number of the animal *must* match the ear notch on the registration papers. Papers must be presented at fair check-in. Any market hog or breeding gilt not having registration papers will show in the crossbred class.

Paperwork Needed for Fair

Members enrolled in Clothing or Bucket Calf have paperwork which must be presented at judging time during the Franklin County Fair. Clothing members must present a Wardrobe Planning Packet and Bucket Calf members must present the project record sheet. Forms are available on the District's 4-H website under "Franklin County Events & Information" or "Project Resources".

Franklin County 4-H youth intending to compete for the Franklin County Born (Meat Goat or Steer) Fair Awards must have the paperwork filled out and turned into the Extension Office by May 1st. Forms are available on the District's 4-H website under "Franklin Events & Information".

Pre-Registration: Fair Project Conference Judging
