



RECORD BOOK & KAP INFORMATION

Filling out a Record Book or KAP can be confusing! Which form do I use? Do I use this one or that one? When is everything due? The following information is for those 4-H members who plan to turn in a record book, KAP or both. Check with Club Leaders as their due date may be earlier than the office's date. Questions can be answered by contacting the Extension Office.

Record Book

A Record Book is <u>non-competitive</u> and is not eligible for county project awards and does not come to the Extension Office. It is judged only by the Club Leader or Committee. All forms can be found on the District's 4-H website under "Forms". The following order is for <u>ANY</u> 4-H member turning in a record book, regardless of age or county origin:

- 1. Personal Page
- 2. 4-H Story (an all-around story)
- 3. Permanent Record (Every member should be updating this record yearly. It becomes very useful when applying for scholarships and writing resumes.)
- 4. Project Records (Generic, age appropriate KAP, or a combination of the two)
- 5. Pictures can be together at the end or can be after each project record. Captions are encouraged!
- 6. Members will need to include the Record Book Check Sheet. Members applying for a pin will also need to include the appropriate pin and/or Key Award application. The Record Book Check Sheet and any pin application should be inside the book but left loose. NOTE: Osage County members will receive a year pin if a Record Book or KAP is completed and turned into the Club Leader.

Member Achievement Pins

Member Achievement Pin Applications are available on the District's 4-H website under "Forms". Those wondering what pin is next may log on to the 4HOnline System and look at the member's "Awards". If questions remain, please contact the Extension Office.

***To be eligible to receive an achievement pin, members may do all KAPs, all generic records or a combination of the two. Regardless, there should be a project record sheet of some sort for each project in which the member is enrolled in order for the member to meet the required criteria on any achievement pin application.



KAP

Only those filling out the KAP will be eligible for county project awards. Forms can be found on the District's 4-H website under "Forms". The following order is for any KAP, regardless of age or county origin:


- I. Personal Page (can be a copy)
- 2. 4-H Story (max. six (6) pages, one-sided, double spaced); younger members (7-8 years of age) can use an all-around story; for all other ages, stories should be project specific.
- 3. KAP Only <u>senior</u> level members (ages 14+), chosen as county champions, are eligible for the next level of judging (Southeast Area Judging).
- 4. Pictures (max. three (3) pages, six (6) photos/page; one for the project, one showing citizenship, one showing leadership; captions are encouraged!
- 5. Each KAP should be in a separate binder or folder with the member's name, club, district/county, age division and project on the front. See the example below in the graphic. DO NOT use dividers, plastic sleeves or include a table of contents. There should be NO LOOSE PAPERS.

Age Appropriate KAP & Important Information

The KAPs are age appropriate (Junior-ages 7-8, Intermediate-ages 9-13 or Senior ages 14+). A member should use his/her 4-H age (as of January 1, 2019) to know which KAP to use. All forms are available on the District's 4-H website under "Forms". All KAPs submitted will be judged against those from the same county and within same age division. County Project Champions will be chosen in all eligible project areas in all three age divisions in all three counties.

***Members are encouraged to fill out the permanent record, the record book check sheet and a pin application (if needed). These three items (including a **copy** of all KAPs or generic records) should be turned into the club leader in the green record book cover by all members turning in record books or KAPs.

***Projects such as livestock (market and breeding), clothing, shooting sports, etc. have multiple levels but <u>require</u> <u>only</u> <u>one</u> KAP or generic project sheet.

Branding Information

All printed 4-H t-shirts, banners, posters, etc. must be cobranded with the K-State Research and Extension logo and the 4-H clover. The brand must be done in a specific fashion and the items should be ordered from an approved vendor. Various branding options can be seen at www.kansas4-h.org/ resources/marketing/index.html (click on "Digital Resources" at the bottom) so decisions can be made on where to place the brand. An approved vendor list and an application to become a licensed vendor may be found at www.k-state.edu/logos/. All groups and clubs planning to place an order are expected to follow these rules. Before ordering, groups should send a copy of all sides of the item to Janae so she can confirm the brand is being used correctly. Contact the Extension Office for a list of locally approved businesses.

Raffle Policy and Guidelines

Clubs discussing fundraising options should note the following information. Nonprofit and education entities may now conduct raffles. However, a raffle policy and guidelines must be followed. Any Extension unit-affiliated group (e.g. 4-H club, 4-H project group, etc.) wanting to conduct a raffle must first fill out and submit an application. The Extension District Board meets at the end of each month and all applications must be approved by them prior to conducting the raffle. A final report must then be presented to the Board upon completion of the raffle. All forms and other requirements can be found on the District's website under "Policies" or in the Extension Office. All completed raffle applications may be sent to or dropped off at any Frontier Extension District Office to await Board approval.

It is for all Kansas 4-H Volunteers and will feature workshops and information to help volunteers be more effective. Register by **October 15th** for the early bird rate or before **November 1st** for the regular rate.

Kansas 4-H Scholarship Information

It's never too early to get started! The 2019-20 Kansas 4-H Scholarship application can be found at www.kansas4-h.org/resources/4-h-library/awards-and-recognition/scholarships.html. This is the only form that will be used. This application requires an agent's signature, so please plan accordingly. Applications are due by **February 1st** to the State 4-H Office. The Vanier Family Scholarship information is also available on this website. The Vanier Family Scholarship information is due by **April 15th** to the State 4-H Office.

4-H Leadership Weekend - KYLF

Rock Springs 4-H Center will be the location for the Kansas Youth Leadership Forum (KYLF) on **November 23-24, 2019**. It is for youth, ages 14-18 before January 1, 2020, and will feature leadership workshops, Youth Council elections and opportunities to learn and have fun. Registration is due by **October 15th** for the early bird rate or before **November 1st** for the regular rate.

4-H Youth Council & National 4-H Conference

The Youth Council and National Conference applications will be combined this year. Applicants will indicate in which opportunity there is interest. Any Kansas 4-H member, 14-18 years of age before January 1, 2020, may apply as a Council Rep and youth, 15-18 years of age before January 1, 2020, may apply for National Conference. The 2019 KYLF delegation will elect representatives from all four extension program areas for a one year term on Council. Up to six National Conference Delegates will be selected through an interview process at KYLF and will serve a two year term on Council.

Youth Council members will help promote, develop, implement and evaluate 4-H Youth Development programs in order to reflect the needs and interests of the youth within the state. Council members will also plan and conduct the Kansas Youth Leadership Forum, Citizenship in Action, 48 Hours of 4-H, Campference and other events.

The National 4-H Conference is a working conference in which youth and adults, at the invitation of the Secretary of Agriculture, assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development programs nationally and in local communities. This event brings together youth, volunteer leaders and state and county Extension Staff members from across the United States, the U.S. Territories and the Canadian Providences.

All information is due by **October 1st.** Two letters of reference must also be included. Visit www.kansas4-h.org/events-activities/national-regional-events/national-4-h-conference/index. html for further details.

KANSAS STATE FAIR - The Fair book is available online at www.kansasstatefair.com. The Extension Office can help with any information and questions.

ENTRIES: STATE REQUIREMENT - The State of Kansas requires all livestock exhibitors to provide a completed W-9 form each year PRIOR to issuing any premium winnings. Complete a W-9 and submit or send it to the Kansas State Fair, ATTN: Competitive Exhibits Dept., 2000 N. Poplar, Hutchinson, KS 67502 prior to the start of the Fair. Forms can also be completed when setting up an exhibitor account at www.kansasstatefair.com.

All Entries Must Be Pre-Registered!

Entering Exhibits for the Kansas State Fair

Horses - Member must be at least nine (9) years old and have qualified at the District Horse Show. Those who qualify at the District level will be entered by the District Horse Show Coordinator. Participants are responsible for any fees.

Visual Arts - Member must be at least nine (9) years old and have had his/her exhibit selected by the judge at a qualifying fair. The number of exhibits chosen is relative to the number of members in the Visual Arts project. Eligible exhibitors will receive a notification (email, call or ribbon) if his/her exhibit has been chosen.

Fiber Arts - Member must be at least nine years old and have received a purple ribbon on the exhibit at a qualifying fair.

Most Other Exhibits - Member must be at least nine years old and have received a purple ribbon on the exhibit at a qualifying fair.

Poultry, Rabbits & Dogs - Member must at least nine years old and have received a purple or blue ribbon at a qualifying show.

Demonstrations/Illustrated Talks - Member must be at least nine (9) years old and have received a purple ribbon on his/her demonstration/illustrated talk at the District Club Day competition in February 2019. Those eligible received an email from the Extension Office in mid July.

Fashion Revue - Member must be at least 14 years of age and have been chosen by the judge to represent the county.

KSF entries MUST BE PRE-ENTERED in the Extension Office by AUGUST 8th.

Getting Exhibits to the Kansas State Fair

All perishable and non-perishable items **must be pre-entered in the Extension Office** by **AUGUST 8th**. It is a simple process. Members may call or come into the Office to pre-enter all State Fair exhibits.

Items going to the State Fair must be turned into his/her home Extension Office. All **non-perishable** exhibits should be brought to the Office by **Wednesday, August 21st.**

Perishable items should be brought to the Extension Office by the following dates and times:

Franklin County: Noon on Thursday, September 5th.

Anderson County: 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 5th

Osage County: 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 5th (NOTE THIS CHANGE!)
