NEW DATES for Small Livestock Tagging

Because of the virus situation, small livestock tagging will be done differently. This year <u>only</u>, small livestock (goats, sheep, swine) do not need to be tagged if the animals are be exhibited at ONLY the county fair(s). Any small livestock to be exhibited at KJLS or KSF will be tagged at the Fairgrounds, 5:30 p.m.-7:00 p.m., **June 1st** at Osage City; **June 2nd** at Ottawa and **June 3rd** at Garnett. Livestock will not be unloaded. Agents/Staff will not enter the trailers. Those attending will need to provide someone to enter the trailer and tag livestock. Families will be invoiced at a later date for EID tag fees via email. Keep in mind, there will be no rate-of-gain contests for small livestock at any Frontier District county fair(s).

District Favorite Food Contest...REVAMPED!

The Frontier District 4-H Favorite Food Contest will be **June 10th** and will be a bit different. Participants will enter a video which must be emailed to Janae at *jmcnally@ksu.edu* by **June 5th**. Participants will need to include a phone number while introducing themselves in the video. If the judge has any questions, he/she will call after 1:00 p.m.-2:00 p.m. during the judging on June 10th. Participants should plan to be available by phone at that time. A complete set of rules and required information is available on the District's 4-H website under "District Events".

Contest details: The contestant will select a favorite food recipe from a food group (snack, salad, dessert, soup, meat, vegetable plate, sandwich, fruit, bread, drink, casserole or other). The prepared favorite food should be displayed in the video with 1) a proper table setting (formal/informal, depending on the food choice), including a centerpiece, optional; 2) a close-up shot of recipe of the favorite food should be included so the judge can read it; 3) a planned menu which includes the favorite food (close-up). Participants should explain how to prepare and serve the favorite food, discuss the nutritional value, and state why the table service, dishes and centerpiece were selected.

The training can be completed online at any time prior to the above date. The cost is \$12.00 per youth payable through the YQCA site. Rabbit Disease in Neighboring State

There is currently an outbreak of Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus Serotype 2 in the United States. One of the current "hot spots" is Prowers County in Colorado (boarders KS to the SW). The disease is currently in the wild rabbit population, so there is no way to control it. The ARBA is working with the USDA and State Vets. 

Youth enrolled in the Rabbit, Fowl or Breeding Livestock project(s) must own and have possession of his/her animal(s) by **June 1st.**

Fair Information and Pre-Entry

The Anderson County Fair will be held **July 27-August 1, 2020.** The theme is "Heroes of the Heartland". Pre-fair judging is usually held a few days before the first day. **All Fair entries must be pre-entered online.** A link will be available **June 15th-July 8th** on the District's 4-H website under "Anderson Events & Information". Anyone not entered during the allotted time will be assessed a \$25 late fee. FYI: There will be no Tractor Pull or Carnival this year.

Bedding/Stall REQUIREMENTS For Fair

At this point, things are progressing and moving forward as in the past. At this time, youth must provide his/her own **LARGE SIZE** shavings for pens/stalls. **Small shavings or straw will not be allowed**. Youth are also responsible for keeping the pens and/or stalls clean. Wash stations will be provided.

4-H Council Meeting and Leader Meeting

The next Anderson County 4-H Council meeting will be Monday, **June 8th** at 7:00 p.m. **via Zoom.** Information on how to participate will be emailed to representatives. Council Members should plan to attend as there must be a representative from each club at every meeting in order for the club to be on track to receive a purple seal at year's end. While only club elected Council members are allowed to vote, all 4-H members, parents or volunteers are welcomed to attend the meetings.


There will be no rate-of-gain contests this year at the Anderson County Fair for any livestock.

Monday, **June 29th-**Mr./Miss 4-H Applications due; All other Fair pre-entries are <u>due</u> to the Ottawa Office or submitted online. A Google Doc for Cat, Dog, Hand Pet, Poultry and Rabbit are required for Fair entry. The Horse entry form is form-fillable but is not a Google Doc. The form must be mailed/emailed to or dropped off at the Extension Office.

Monday, **June 29th-**Beef, all Dairy, Goats, Sheep and Swine: The "Livestock Count" Google Doc **MUST** be filled out and will take the place of the stall reservation form. Those planning to sell an animal at the Market Sale **MUST** fill out the "Virtual Livestock Sale" Google Doc, too.

ALL judging will be at the Fairgrounds. There will be no conference judging in any project area (except Cat/Handpet and Bucket Calf interviews). All exhibits/livestock will be dropped off/come in, judged and picked up/leave in the same day. If a family cannot pick up exhibits at the appointed times, a friend/fellow 4-H member should be contacted. The Extension Office **WILL NOT** be responsible for items left.
