General Requirements/Guidelines:

- 2. Proficient communication skills:
 - a. Respond to all notifications within 24 hours, if possible. Consult your parents/guardians prior to making commitments.
 - b. Communication will occur between Extension Staff, Adult Leader, and Ambassadors.
- 3. Active participation in Ambassador meetings and Ambassador events.
- 4. Attendance:
 - a. Attendance is required at all Ambassador meetings and events.
 - b. If the Ambassador cannot attend a meeting or event, they must communicate with the Extension Staff and Adult Leader as soon as possible.
 - c. More than 3 consecutive or 5 total absences will result in a meeting with Extension Staff, Adult Leader, Ambassador and Ambassador's parents/guardians to discuss future in the program.
- 5. Attend one of the following Leadership Trainings:
 - a. State Ambassador Training (When held)
 - b. State Youth Leadership Forum (KYLF)
 - c. Discovery Days
 - d. Citizenship In Action (CIA)
 - e. Other State-Wide Leadership Trainings
- 6. Attend local Ambassador Training
- 7. Uphold the 4-H Code of Conduct.
- 8. Participation in District Club Days.
- 9. Be actively enrolled in the Leadership Project.
- 10. Be an active member in your local club.
