The Happiness Curve of Aging

Older adults report improved contentment as they age despite increasing losses. The accumulation of loss is overemphasized by vounger people who then develop ageist beliefs. This ageism can be internalized by older adults leading to poorer performance on cognitive tests, poorer health and even shorter lives. This presentation is meant to enlighten participants to age-stereotyping and ageism and can be used as a score sheet for owning one's own age.

Gayle Doll, PhD, FAGHE, FGSA, has been the director of the Kansas State University Center on Aging for 15 years. Her team is responsible for preparing students to work with older adults, conducting research about aging issues pertaining to long term care and the sexuality of older persons, and providing outreach and educational support to more than half of the nursing homes in Kansas through the PEAK program. She has earned several teaching awards including the Myers-Alfred teaching award, the Commerce Bank undergraduate teaching award, and the Great Plains IDEA Faculty Fellowship Award. Doll authored a book, Sexuality in Long-Term Care, in 2013. She has made dozens of presentations around the United States and Canada. She's enjoying aging and the rewards that come with it — seeing her family expand with three daughters-in-law, three grandchildren, and a granddog or two, and finding the time for hobbies such as exercise, painting, gardening, and traveling with her husband, Rick.
