Meal

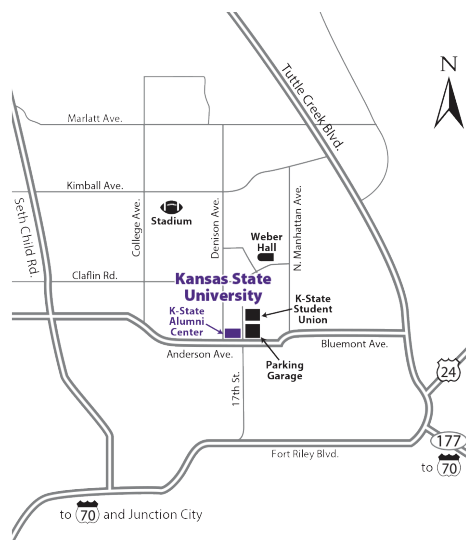
A Cox Brothers pork meal will be provided.
